USCIS EL PASO DISTRICT ASSISTS IN ARREST OF A CONVICTED PERSON

EL PASO- A man convicted of a controlled substance in Alaska, April 1998, and again in El Paso, on October 1998, was arrested yesterday after officers from U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) discovered that his conviction rendered him inadmissible. Officers from Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) arrested Armando Ascencion Sandoval, a native of Mexico, at the El Paso Office, as Sandoval was attempting to file an application to renew his alien registration card. The violation was uncovered following routine background checks that are conducted for every applicant requesting specific immigration services or benefits.

“Public safety is paramount to this agency,” said District Director Raymond Adams. “When we encounter someone in a USCIS office who has violated the law, we will work with our law enforcement partners to take the appropriate action.”
